

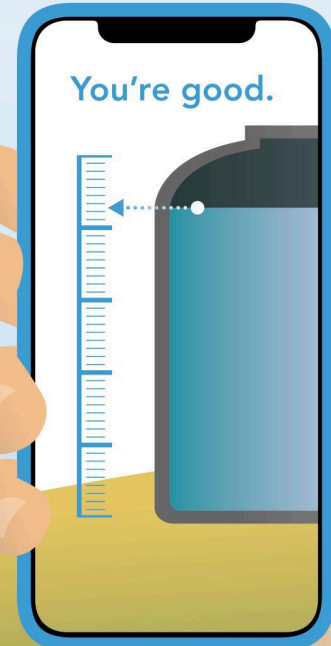

## The Lake Berryessa Renaissance Process - An Update (Downdate, Sidedate, Nodate?)

In 2011 I wrote an article titled "They're Off Like a Herd of Turtles" about the slow progress of the Pensus Group in redeveloping the resorts for which they had won the concession contracts, especially Steele Park Resort (which they unfortunately renamed "Lupine Shores").

The slow progress of Pensus was basically due to the bureaucratic restrictions imposed on Pensus by the Bureau of Reclamation. Those who remember those dark days will recall the BOR's "seamless transition" promise. "

Fast forward to 2023.

### They're Off Like a Herd of Turtles! (Part 2 - 2023)

The present situation brings to mind a quote sometimes attributed to Mark Twain (but unconfirmed). "History may not repeat itself, but it sure does rhyme."

As many of you know, I'm disappointed with the speed of the Lake Berryessa "renaissance" process, especially since the Bureau of Reclamation had done much planning after the abortive 2015 bid process which resulted in no bids acceptable to the BOR. The BOR invested in several studies and planning efforts to shorten the time needed for environmental studies by any new concessioner.

But Sun Outdoors had the option to simply shut down Steele Canyon and Spanish Flat during the planning and rebuilding process if they wished. Some lobbying by the Lake Berryessa News and Napa County

convinced them to remain open. Subsequently Sun made a considerable profit last year at Steele Canyon and Spanish Flat because of camping and boat launching fees. Sun raised those rates when they took over - a relatively unpopular move since they did no upgrades of any kind to the facilities.

So, what has actually been happening since the agreement between Napa County and Sun Outdoors was signed on October 19, 2021? We are getting close to the deadlines in the original agreement.

1.3 Period of Negotiations. The Parties agree to negotiate one or more DDAs (Disposition and Development Agreements) for the Properties for a twenty-four (24) month period ending on October 18, 2023 ("Negotiation Period"), commencing on the Effective Date (October 19, 2021).

1.3.2 The "Approval Period" shall be twenty (20) months starting on February 19, 2022 and ending on October 18, 2023 to complete the environmental analysis documents in accordance with the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") and the National Environmental Policy Act ("NEPA") and secure all necessary permits, licenses, governmental approvals, including rezoning, if necessary, approval to extend utilities to the boundary of the Property, and all other governmental approvals, permits and licenses required for Concessionaire to commence and complete the development of the Property (the "Governmental

Approval").

2.5 Community Outreach meetings. Concessionaire will conduct a series of public outreach meetings (minimum of 2) within the general Lake Berryessa community prior to finalizing the site plans and executing the DDAs. The purpose of the meetings is to present Concessionaire's proposals and receive public input.

\*\*\*\*\*

Apparently, Sun Outdoors is dealing with multiple construction design details and typical project planning and environmental program delays. Also, the water/wastewater system expansion and upgrade is taking longer and costing more than Sun originally thought.

The majority of the Lake Berryessa community is hoping for Sun's ultimate success in their endeavor. In response to the Lake Berryessa News queries, Napa County has released the following formal statement:

"Moving forward, Napa County's plan is to award the ground lease and operating agreement in 2024, followed by groundbreaking that same year.

Napa County will continue to organize community outreach meetings with the developer, and will inform the public of the confirmed dates and details. The groundbreaking is tentatively expected to commence late 2024/early 2025.

In addition, it is confirmed that the upgrade to the NBRID will be followed by work on Steele Canyon before proceeding to Spanish Flat."

### Steele Canyon - Spanish Flat Buoys Are Gone!

Hundreds of Lake Berryessa boaters will be happy to know that the buoy line at the mouth of the cove leading to the Steele Canyon, Caplell Cove, and Spanish Flat launch ramps has been removed.

The 5MPH buoys have been returned to their original locations near the launch ramps themselves, thereby shortening the time from launching to laking significantly.

But please drive your boat slowly and safely to the main body of the lake before you increase to cruising speed.

### Safety first!

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2 Editor's Note: My chief adviser chided me for bringing up the Big Island Lagoon issue again, but my philosophy in dealing the the disaster the Bureau of Reclamation caused at Lake Berryessa is "Never Forget".

**Why is Big Island Lagoon Closed to the Boating Public, But Not Willi's Cove?**

In a highly unpopular move with no real public support the Bureau of Reclamation arbitrarily closed Big Island Lagoon, a traditional family boating rest area, to motorized recreation more than ten years ago. The final 2006 Record of Decision (ROD) simply stated that "certain areas of the lake are reserved for non-motorized water craft and trolling engines." The areas so designated were not actually described in the ROD, but were simply drawn on a map of the lake - Big Island Lagoon and the area near Steele Park known as Willi's Cove. No other public notification nor request for public input was made prior to the release of the 2006 ROD.

#### 2006 Record of Decision: Future Recreation Use and Operations of Lake Berryessa

6. Land and Water Use Classification. The WROS is not adopted as part of the VSP ROD. Existing requirements developed in conjunction with Action 17, "Water Surface Zoning and Restrictions," of the 1993 RAMP ROD are carried forward on an interim basis pending future adoption by Reclamation of the WROS or other land and water use classification system in consultation with the forum established in paragraph 1c. In the interim, certain areas will be reserved for use by non-motorized water craft and electric trolling motors only. These areas are identified in Appendix B, map number 413-202-8.

The creation of these "exclusive use" nonmotorized zones was basically a stealth move by Reclamation to buy off various environmental exclusionist groups and to get them to support the plan to eliminate the existing resorts. The BOR, with no supporting data or public meetings, closed the Big Island Lagoon to family boaters who wished to spend some quiet time in this popular protected area off the main body of the lake.

The Big Island Lagoon has been open only to non-motorized craft since 2006. The BOR "s own policy states that when making serious changes to recreation amenities they would accept public comment to assist in decision-making, monitor the effectiveness of the changes, and modify the policy as appropriate. What is odd about this situation is that Reclamation never implemented this "non-motorized zone" designation at Willi's Cove.

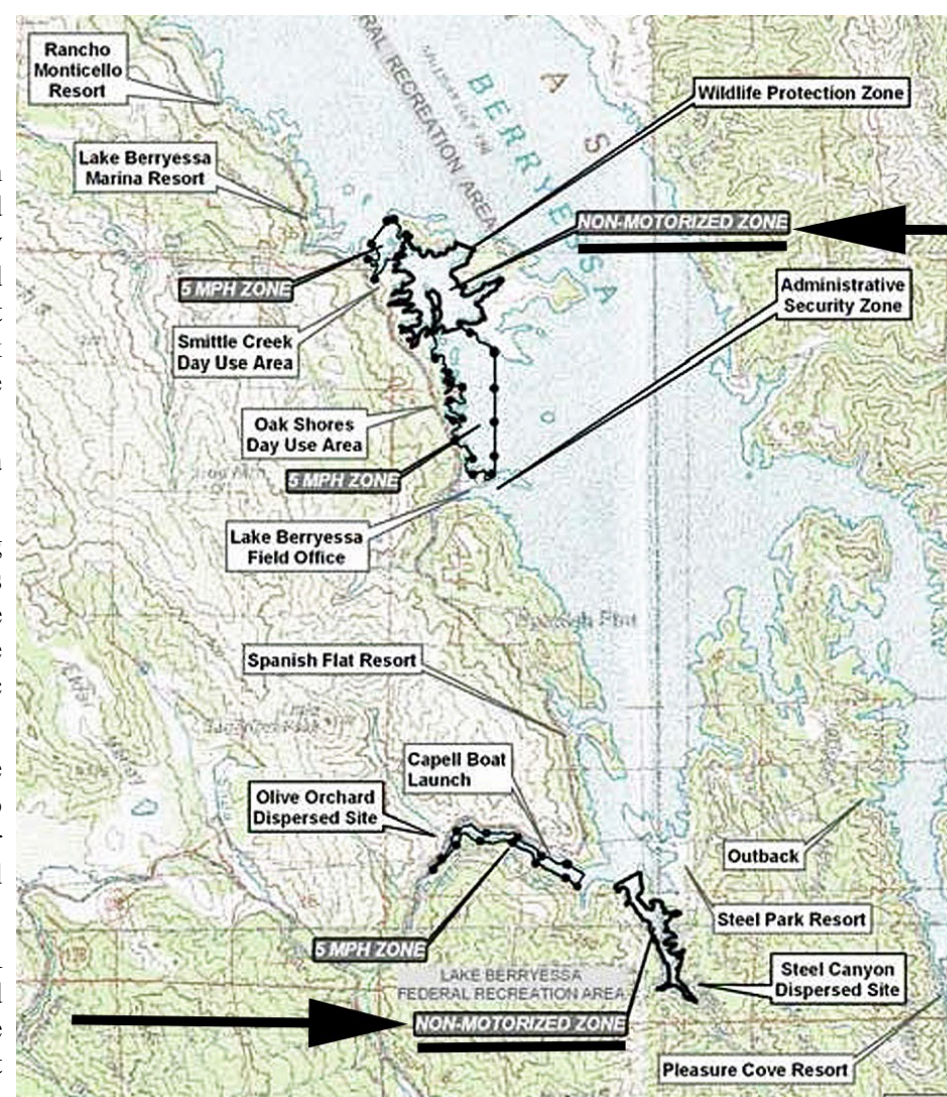
The justification for this action was silly then and has been proven by observation over the following years to be completely false. This restriction should be eliminated because years of data show that almost no one now uses that "exclusive use" space except a few random kayakers per year, most of them rentals from the nearby rental business at Spanish Flat. The Big Island Lagoon should be open to all of the boating public as a 5 MPH or "No Wake" zone as it was previously designated.

#### A Lake Berryessa Midsummer Night's Dream (With Apologies to William Shakespeare)

I had a memory the other day of tubing and jet skiing on Lake Berryessa with friends and family. For a break we'd drift in to the Big Island Lagoon at 5 mph to float quietly with the other folks on patio boats, houseboats, or even some in kayaks. It was a quiet, safe place to float or even to put your deck chair on a sand bar and kick back in six inches of water while kids splashed around you. Later it was time for prime rib or pizza at the Steele Park Boathouse Restaurant savoring one of the most beautiful views on the lake.

But then I had a nightmare that a Dark Force swept down on Lake Berryessa and destroyed our homes and resorts, tearing up launch ramps, demolishing restaurants, eliminating access to the lake for years - even denying entry to the Big Island Lagoon to everyone except some phantom kayakers who never showed up.

But then, this being mid-summer, I had a comforting Midsummer Night's Dream. I saw myself sitting at a beautiful floating marina restaurant and bar, sipping a margarita, with my trusty low-emissions, quiet, environmentally friendly jet ski at my side. Happy families were once again drifting slowly into the Big Island Lagoon for a rest stop. New resorts were providing launching and pleasant new facilities to visitors from all over the Bay Area. Just before I woke up, I was once again looking out at that fantastic Steele Canyon Recreation Area view, but now it was from a brand new restaurant.



#### Solano Irrigation District 2023 Irrigation Season

Every year Solano Irrigation District delivers irrigation water to over 36,700 acres of agriculture within Solano County. Between the months of March and October, SID distributes, on average, 116,000 acre-feet of water to our customer's orchards, farms, and vineyards.

The volume delivered hinges on multiple factors, such as weather, precipitation, crops planted, and length of the season. Depending on customer demand in a given season, the District may not deliver the entirety of its allocated water and that unused amount becomes "carryover" for use in the next year's water season, thus increasing the total supply for the next year.

The District's main agricultural water supply, 121,000 acre-feet, comes from surface water stored behind the Monticello Dam at Lake Berryessa. A smaller portion, up to 10,000 acre-feet, comes from groundwater sources spread throughout the District. Not including carryover, 131,000 acre-feet spread across the 36,700 acres of irrigated land, equates to roughly 3.5 acre-feet/acre of allocation to our customers.

As it happens, not all crops use the same amount of water. Some growers may use less than their full allocation and there are others who would like to use more than their allocation if made available. For this reason, Staff starts with an initial allocation recommendation to the Board at the beginning of a water season, usually between 3 to 4 acre-feet/acre.

The 2023 season has already distinguished itself from last year. Not only are we starting off with a more typical 3.5 acre-feet per acre, but there has also been significant rainfall to-date. The abundance of precipitation has led to a later start to the growing season.

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## Agricultural Commissioner releases 2022 Napa County Agricultural Crop Report

Napa County saw an increase in the gross value of all agricultural production in the county totaling \$894,295,500 in 2022 – a 19.9 percent increase from the previous year.

The total value of the 2022 winegrape crop was \$890,911,400, up 20.1 percent or \$149,179,400 from the previous year. Total winegrape production increased by approximately 10,613 tons or 8.8 percent from 2021. The total winegrape tonnage for the 2022 crop (131,144 tons from 46,128 bearing acres) was 13.5 percent lower than the previous 10-year average of 151,574 tons, however the total winegrape value was 22.5 percent higher than the previous 10-year average. The average price paid per ton for all winegrapes was \$6,794, a 10.4 percent increase from 2021.

In 2022, the top three varieties in total value were Cabernet Sauvignon, Chardonnay and Merlot. Approximately 72,423 tons of Cabernet Sauvignon (24,217 acres) were harvested and sold at an average price of \$8,819 per ton. Chardonnay (5,897 acres) exceeded Merlot (3,983 acres) by 1,914 bearing acres, but sold at \$972 less per ton on average. Merlot production was 8,552 tons, valued at an average of \$4,527 per ton. Chardonnay production of 16,094 tons was valued on average at \$3,555 per ton. These three varieties together accounted for approximately 74 percent of all production and more than 82 percent of the total winegrape value.

Olive production increased by 59 tons in 2022. Despite continuing pressure from olive fruit flies and some adverse weather conditions, many growers reported substantially higher harvested acres and total tonnage than the previous year. Total livestock and poultry values decreased \$947,000 from those reported in 2022, while field crops increased \$81,600. Vegetable crop values were higher in 2022 despite a slight decrease in harvest acreage. Floral and nursery production area and value were lower this year, primarily due to the closure of some industry establishments.

County staff completed 65,559 pest detection traps servicings in 2022, looking for pests that could harm the county’s agriculture and natural ecosystems. The team continued to survey for all life stages of the glassy-winged sharpshooter (GWSS) this year. More than 2,600 plant shipments were inspected for GWSS and released in 2022.

## Napa Valley Register reducing print days

It is now confirmed that the Napa Valley Register will be dropping its print editions from seven days a week to three in July. There are also rumors that it may drop further to two editions. It’s not yet clear if they will publish a digital newsletter on the “off” days or will only have three issues per week even online.



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## The Bureau of Reclamation Announces New Summer Hours at Lake Berryessa

### Dufer Point Visitor Center

Park Rangers will continue to staff the Dufer Point Visitor Center from noon to 3 p.m. on weekends and holidays.

### Oak Shores Day Use

Starting May 26, the north end of Oak Shores will reopen for day use from 7:30 a.m. to 8 p.m. on Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays only. South Oak Shore will be open daily from 7:30 a.m. to 8 p.m.

### Smittle Creek and Eticuera Day Use

Smittle Creek and Eticuera are available for wildlife watching, picnicking, and hand launching watercraft throughout the year. The Smittle Creek Trail remains closed due to damage sustained during the LNU Lightning Complex Fire. Park Rangers will close the parking lot gates by 8 p.m. throughout the summer.

### Capell Cove Boat Launch

The Capell Cove Boat Launch is open from 4 a.m. to 10 p.m. throughout the year.

Oak Shores, Smittle Creek, Eticuera, and Capell are propane only day use areas. No charcoal barbecues are permitted lake-wide per Napa County ordinances.

Annual passes are available at the Dufer Point Visitor Center by appointment during the week or on weekends between 12-3 p.m.

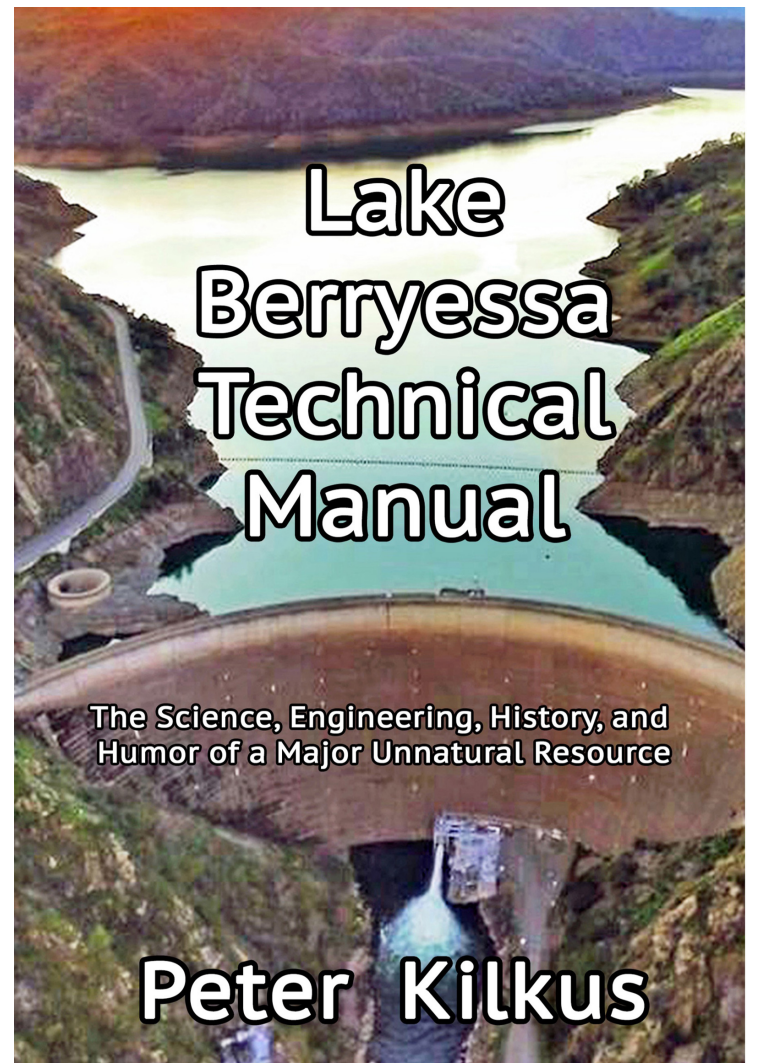
# The Science, Engineering, History, and Humor of a Major Unnatural Resource

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This technical manual is designed to answer questions people might have about the design and operation of the lake and its facilities. I constantly answer questions from readers about the lake. During the last twenty-five years that I've been at Lake Berryessa, I've had many questions myself. Hopefully, you will enjoy learning about the science and engineering details of Lake Berryessa in this manual, as well as some history and humor.



Lake Berryessa Statistics: June 1, 2023

The lake level started falling on May 11 and is down now to 430.2', 9.8' below Glory Hole. A record 2022-2023 rainfall season of 41.86 inches is the second highest since 1998 (46.3"). The dam output has risen from the minimum 45 cfs required by law and contract to an average of 400 cfs driven by Solano County agricultural requirements as the weather warms and the growing season begins.

Evaporation has reached .25 inches per day. The Gamble Gauge has dropped to 88.4% capacity. On historical average the lake only drops about 10 - 15 feet per summer. We should have plenty of water to enjoy for years - even if another drought begins.

Water temperature hovers around 70 degrees at the surface to 10 feet down. The water temperature rose to around 53 degrees from 40 feet to the bottom.

Some fun facts about water use:

- 1 human family (up to 5 people) uses 1 A-F/yr
- 1 dairy cow or horse uses .038 A-F/yr
- Therefore, 1 human family = 26 cows or 26 horses
- 300 chickens or 3 pigs use .017 A-F/yr
- Therefore, 1 human family = 17,648 chickens or 176 pigs

- 1 CFS equals 1.98 AF per day
- 1 A-F of water = 1 foot of water on 1 acre
- 1 A-F of water = 325,851 Gallons
- 1 A-F of water = 43,560 Cubic Feet
- 1 CFS = 448.8 GPM

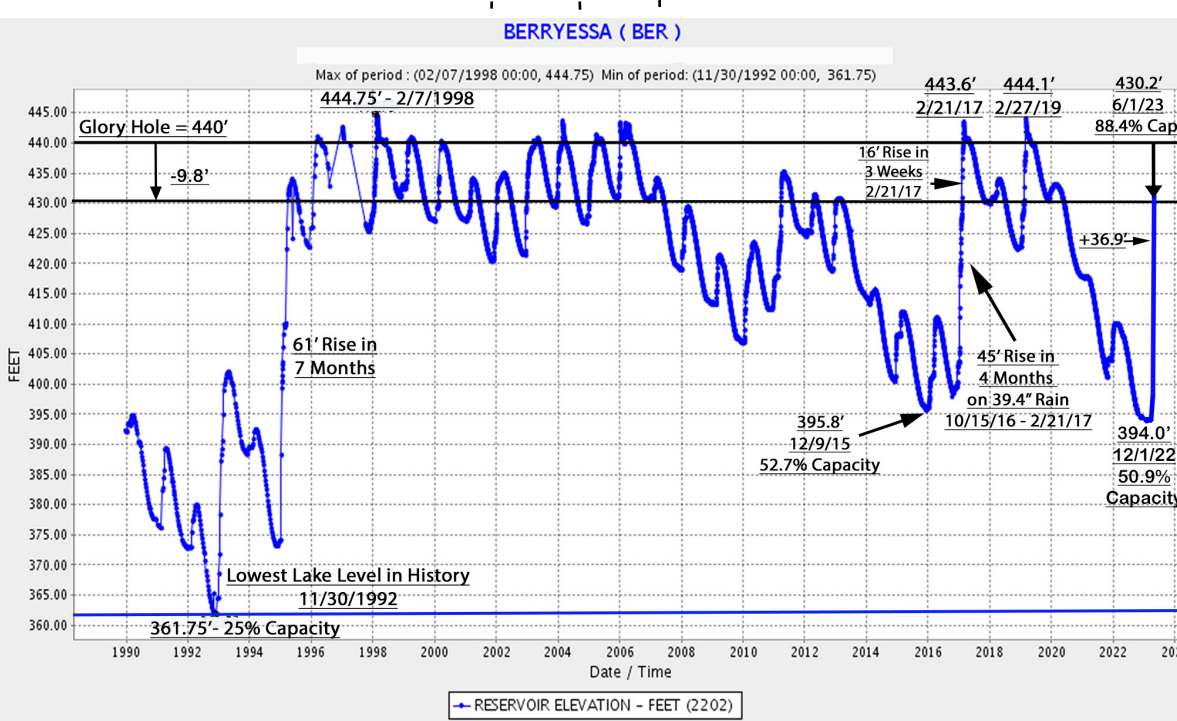
Lake Berryessa surface level is about 20,700 acres when full but decreases as it empties. The new capacity of the lake was changed from 1,600,00 A-F to 1,555,300 A-F in 2013 after a detailed bathymetric study of the actual lake contours.

The required minimum output of 45 CFS equates to 89.1 A-F per day. At the minimum output it would take about 230 days for the lake to drop 1 ft. when full - excluding evaporation.

The maximum output reaches about 700 cfs during the growing season or 1,388 A-F/day. At the maximum output it would take 15 days for the lake to drop 1 ft. when full - excluding evaporation.

Solano Irrigation District's (SID) 75th Anniversary

SID was formed in February, 1948 to provide irrigation water toproperties in Solano County. In the 1970s it began serving non-potable and potable water to customers. Today SID has about 750 agricultural customer connections, about 9,404 potable water customer connections, and severakl hundred non-potable water connections.
